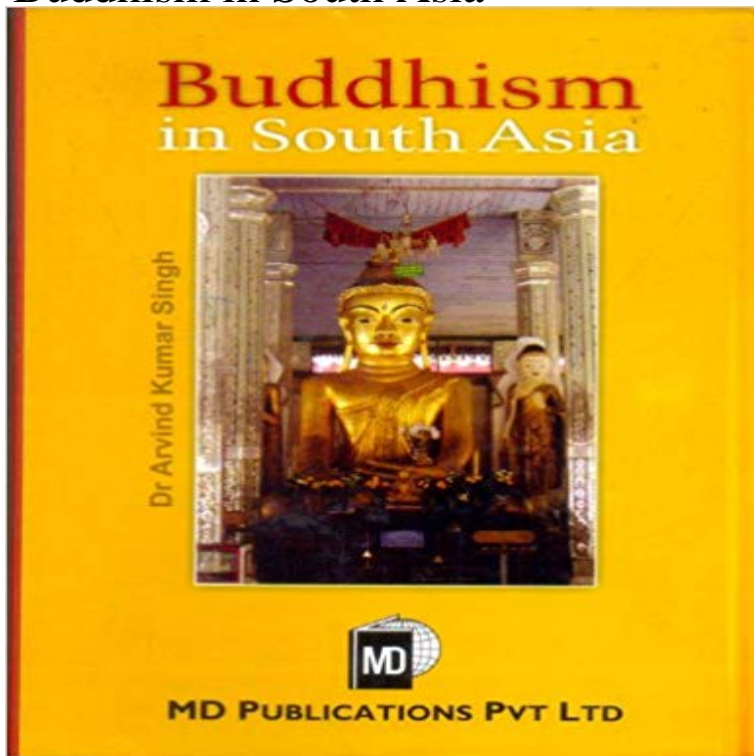


Buddhism in South Asia
