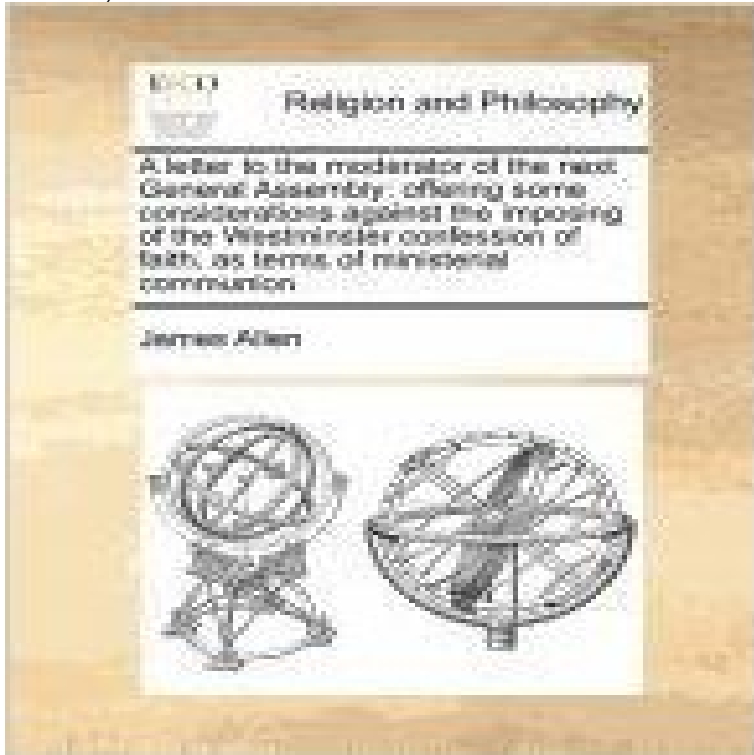


A letter to the moderator of the next General Assembly: offering some considerations against the imposing of the Westminster confession of faith, as terms of ministerial communion
