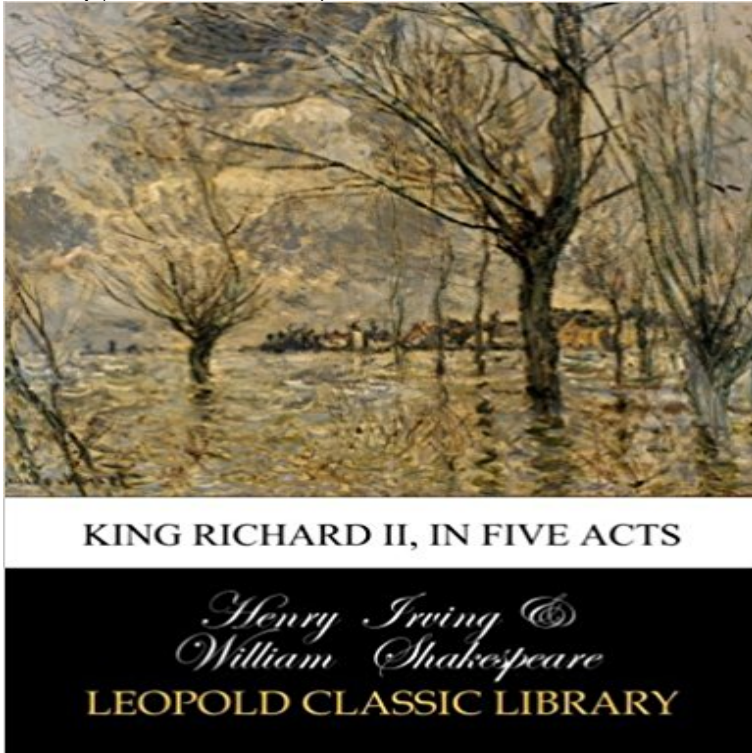


King Richard II, in five acts
