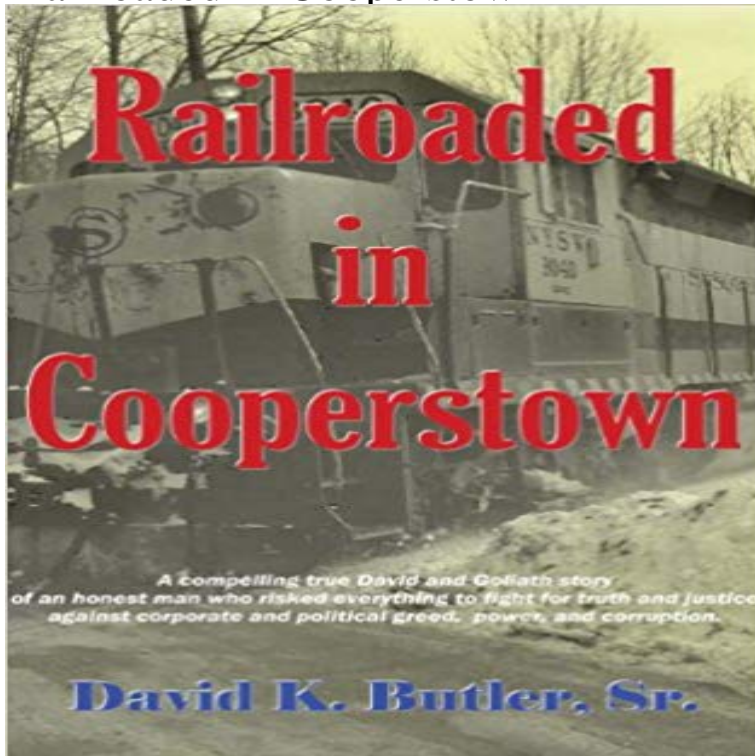


Railroaded in Cooperstown
