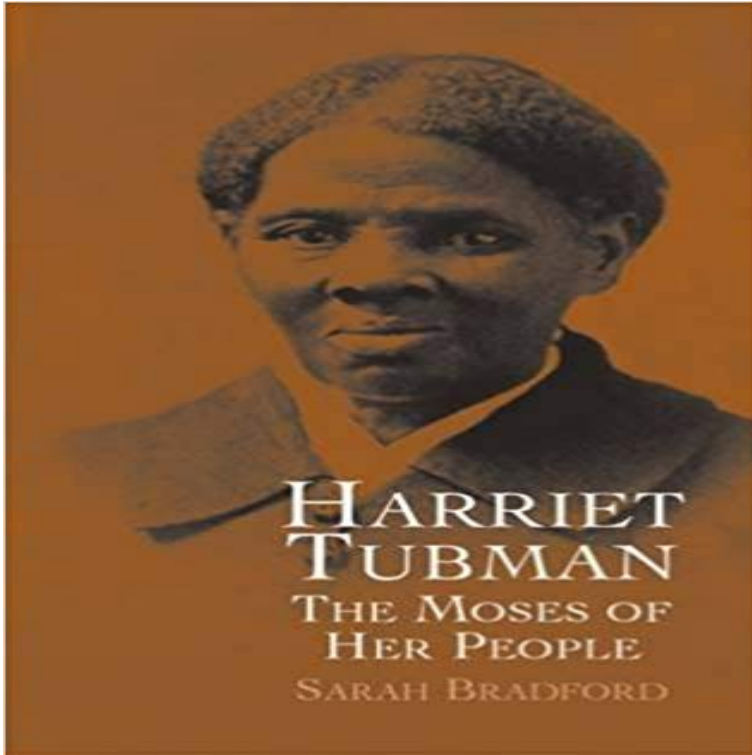


Harriet Tubman: The Moses of Her People (African American)
