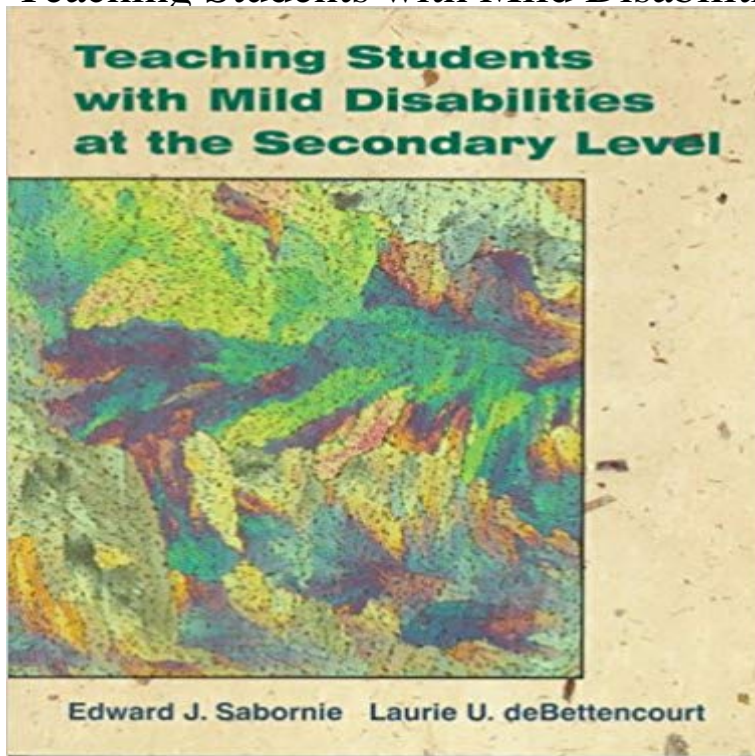


Teaching Students with Mild Disabilities at the Secondary Level
