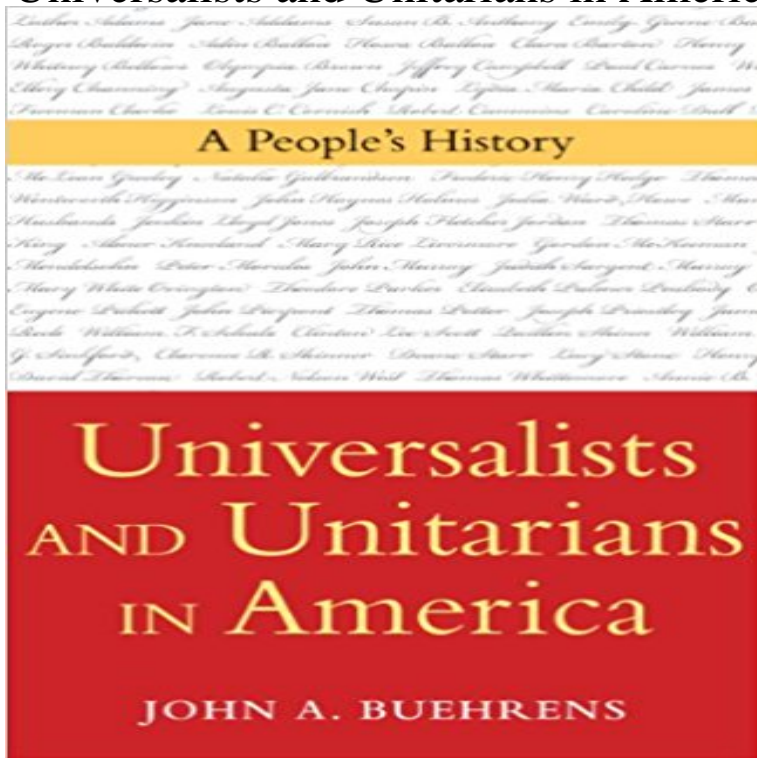


Universalists and Unitarians in America: A Peoples History
